Background

CEMEX S.A.B. de C.V, the multinational manufacturer and distributor of cement, concrete and aggregates for the building industry, has applied to **Hampshire County Council (HCC) to Quarry for Gravel and Sand at the former Hamble Airfield site.**

If approved, this planning application could directly affect your business.

Cemex's proposal

- Cemex plans to extract up to **1.69million tonnes** of sharp sand and gravel from the airfield – before restoring the site once complete
- Up to **144 HGV movements per day** will be needed to export the sand/gravel, and import backfill materials during restoration
- A new **site entrance on the east side of Hamble Lane** between the Police headquarters and the railway bridge
- All **HGVs accessing the site will travel along Hamble Lane** and over Hamble 'Halt' railway bridge.
- This process is likely to take **up to 14 years** to complete

How could this affect your business – questions to consider:

What will more congestion on Hamble Lane mean...

- **For your operations and financial performance?**
 - How would your business be affected by a significant delay on Hamble Lane or an incident near the Hamble 'Halt' railway bridge? Describe the impact to your supply chain and movement of goods.
 - What is the value of the financial loss caused by a significant delay?



- **For your business continuity and risk management?**
 - What is the potential impact to your business and employees if emergency services were delayed?
 - How would your insurers view this risk and associated cost?
- **For your employees?**
 - Could you struggle to recruit or retain employees if their commute is increased?
 - How could the health and safety of your employees who cycle/walk to work be affected?
- **For your customers?**
 - Do you rely on public footfall or tourism to Hamble?
 - Could you see a reduction in customers, who may avoid the traffic and visit other waterfront villages and marinas in Hampshire?
